

Where to begin?



(Each is dependent upon the other)



Identify and Manage

The Audience (critical issue)

- The Issue (bite sized pieces)
- The Action (frame the issue data driven)
- Follow-Up (possible partners)



Educate, Engage

- The Audience (who needs education?)
- The Goal (what is to be achieved? how to humanize the issue?)
- The Action (how to break into manageable pieces)
- Continuation (data and impact information)



Convey Results

- The Audience (tailoring efforts to the audience)
- The Vehicle (authenticity)
- The Result (what worked best; understand success or failure)
